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
Staff Development Fund

So I hope that it will be valuable for other professional services colleagues around the university partnership who might be wondering whether ALPINE is for them – it is!!"

Building educational leadership capacity

The LTA is taking forward a range of initiatives to build educational leadership within the university. Two current examples of this are the Aurora Leadership Development programme and the Jisc Digital Leadership Programme. The support provided by the LTA reflects findings of current research literature, where the limited impact of some leadership programmes has been attributed to a lack of supporting opportunities for participants to apply their learning on completion of the programme.

Applications for the five places on the Advance HE Aurora Leadership programme closed on 19 September. Successful applicants will undertake six inter-connected development days in Edinburgh from November 2019 to March 2020. Open all ours: Open Education, what it means for you and for the university: Wednesday 20 November 2019

This one day event will look at open educational practice and will introduce the forthcoming Open Education Framework. An overview of the preliminary findings from the latest Open Education Survey will also be discussed.

The keynote, titled: Into the Open - exploring the benefits of open education, will be delivered by Lorna M. Campbell, manager of the University of Edinburgh's OER Service will will provide an introduction to the broad domain of open education, including OER, open practice, MOOCs, open knowledge and Wikimedia. Highlighting examples of openness in action from the University of Edinburgh, she will explore how open education and OER can help to expand access to education, widening participation and social inclusion, promoting knowledge transfer and creating a culture of inter-institutional collaboration and sharing.





Co-operative University event: monday 11 November 2019

On Monday the 11th November, the Learning and Teaching Academy will be co-hosting an event exploring current developments to establish a Co-Operative University within the UK. Colleagues from the Co-Operative University Project will lead an exploration of the concept and ethos of the Co-Operative University, who the partners in the project are, progress to date, and ambitions going forward. There will also be input from UHI colleagues exploring the nature of tertiary education in distributed contexts, and hands-on activity exploring the civic responsibilities of universities.

'Exploring Federated Models and the Idea of the Civic University' will be held at An Lochran, Inverness Campus, and by videoconference for those who would like to participate online. A call for participation and registration will follow in the week beginning 14th October.

LTA event supports programme enhancement

Heather Fotheringham from the LTA ran a development day with colleagues from the Geography degree on 27 August 2019 to investigate the use of group work. Prompted by student feedback through the National Student Survey (NSS), teaching staff and a student rep reviewed the use of group work across the programme, and discussed different models for grading contribution to group projects. Changes to teaching and assessment informed by the day will be taken forward in the upcoming programme revalidation.

The University Mentoring Scheme

The second annual University Mentoring Scheme residential took place in the last week of August with twenty colleagues coming together from across the University.
